For example:

- Associate with other large events
- Host a clean up the beach day
- Host a celebratory lunch
- Keynote speakers

There isn't a right or wrong way to do this - the main objective is to undertake a patrol, educate members and the community about being green, and start one initiative that will build connections. It is an opportunity to showcase initiatives and start a conversation with our members and community.

It is critical that your patrol is delivered like any other patrol, meeting all the required standards, roles, and responsibilities.

Green Patrol activity ideas and resources

Connections and networks

- Register your patrol with Clean Up Australia.
- Connect with your <u>local community environmental</u> groups and <u>local government</u> <u>association</u>.
- <u>Marine Mammal Foundation</u> is a great resource. With the opportunity to partner, the team can provide resources and education opportunities.

Activities

- Undertake a snorkel patrol and challenge members to find rubbish in the water and surrounding areas.
- Clean up the beach challenge and award prizes for most rubbish collected.
- <u>Trivia challenge</u> with an environmental theme.
- <u>Recycle challenge</u> provide items where people must decide what can be recycled and not.
- Education session engage an organisation or speaker to educate members, such as Marine Mammals foundation.



- Event and keynote speakers host an event a breakfast, morning tea, lunch etc, use all sustainable materials and bring in a keynote speaker to inspire.
- Use social media, educate with key stats, promote and run competitions. Ask members to clean up in their local communities and document online.
- Use sustainable products such as chalk on footpaths to promote the event.
- Tell the local stories, acknowledge and embrace traditional owners, use LSV acknowledgement of country and undertake education initiatives.
- Dress in sustainable green, use green zinc and other references.
